The Knife Angel....Ever Heard of It?

It's a sculpture, 27 foot high, made from 100,000 confiscated knives and was completed in 2018. 200 knife banks were created nationwide and amnesties were held for individuals to anonymously donate their knives. Knives seized by police were also included. The Knife Angel has been on tour around the UK and made it to Newtown a few years ago.

Its purpose is to highlight knife crime in the United Kingdom and educate young people on the harmful effect violent behaviour can have on their communities.

It is a cause of concern that there seems to be people, especially students, carrying knives, which they say is for their protection. We remember the recent death of the young lad in Sheffield, while in school. It is also apparent that such crimes seem to be committed when the students are unsupervised - before school (the incident Croydon), lunchtime. in (Sheffield) and after school.

I know that while I was a Street Pastor in Northampton, I probably sat next to and

conversed with individuals who were carrying weapons, like many other Street Pastors up and down the country. The interesting fact is that police forces throughout the country state that while Street Pastors are out in the communities, there are fewer incidents that require their presence. Whether this is the non-judgemental attitude of the Street Pastors or the Prayer Pastors, who support the patrols while they are out......I'll leave that decision to you.

School Pastors are regarded as a valuable resource to the communities. They usually support students after school for only about an hour, and can provide a calm, reassuring presence. With this in mind, there is to be a meeting at the police station in Tywyn on Monday, March 3rd from 3pm.

The local police and British Transport Police, Council and members from a variety of the Churches feel that this can only be beneficial to the community. St Cadfan's has agreed to support this initiative financially and the police are seeking further grants.

If you are interested in finding out more, please do come along. After all, we need to keep everyone safe.

The Archbishop's Visit Roger Whitehouse

On Sunday March 9th there will one service in Bro Ystumanner, a Ministry Area Holy Eucharist in St Cadfan's Church, Tywyn at 11.15 a.m. The Most Revd Andrew John, Archbishop of Wales and Bishop of Bangor, will preside at this service.

We are most grateful for the pastoral care and concern shown in our present circumstances by both the Archbishop and Archdeacon Robert. In particular, the Archbishop will be making a round trip of about 70 miles each way on Sunday 9th. He wishes to meet as many of us as possible, so please support the service he is leading, even if it is not in your usual church.

People from several other churches in the Area will contribute to the service, and the offertory money on the open plate will go to Ministry Area funds.

Eco Ystumanner Gardening with Birds Max Birchenough

Do you regularly find bulbs and other plants popping up in parts of your garden where you didn't place them? We do, and we have come to the conclusion that our wonderful local birdlife is the culprit.

We don't mind, as a little unexpected variety is actually rather welcome. The principle can be repeated widely in dealing with the great outdoors, particularly in land management.

There has been a welcome recognition in recent years that old ways of controlling nature with rigidly-planned drainage projects and the like are not helpful, and actually make problems such as flood control harder.

Restoring peat bogs, un-straightening rivers, and the use of small dams to help slow down the flow of water are now seen as the way forward.

We can perhaps take note of this in our gardens, selecting plants which like the soil we have, and allowing birds and insects freer rein than we have perhaps done in the past.

And, of course, we should be praying that enlightened land management will spread everywhere.

A lot has happened in the last few months and, as a family, we are still coming to terms with Paul's death on January 19th, Ruth's breast cancer diagnosis on December 10th and continuing treatment.

We were amazed by the number of people who came to celebrate Paul's life on February 14th. Paul's one regret would be not being able to be there chatting and catching up with everyone! Thank you to all those who were able to be physically present, those who were with us in heart and mind, those who took part in the service, the many who helped to provide food for a fantastic tea in Neuadd Pendre and the team who set up, served drinks, and cleared up afterwards. You all made it a very special day of remembering and reconnecting......... Diolch yn fawr iawn!

Ruth's medical journey continues. Further treatment is aimed at decreasing the risk of cancer coming back.

She has now seen the consultant oncologist. Due to the fact that she is still a 'young women' (the consultant's words!), the tumor being quite large (64mm), one of the 9 lymph nodes removed testing positive, and lobular breast cancer statistically being more likely to recur than other types of breast cancer, she will be having 6 months of chemotherapy starting in the next few weeks. Therefore, you might not see a huge amount of her due to the need to protect herself from infection. However, she continues to hold you and all the churches in her thoughts and prayers. Thank you from us all for all your prayers and support!






